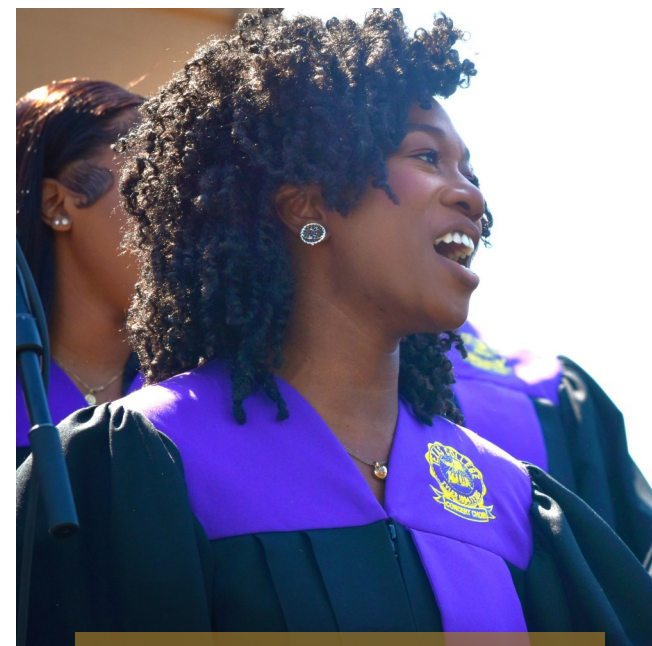

MUSIC AT TEXAS COLLEGE

Texas College's Music Department has a strong liberal arts foundation that supports the development of knowledge and skills needed for qualified musicians in the 21st century. The degree plan requires students to take a compilation of specific music and general education courses designed to provide balanced intellectual preparation, in keeping with the mission of the College.

The Music Department offers intensive preparation for students seeking to enter graduate programs and/or the world of professional music.

The College's Department of Music invites musicians of all levels ready to pursue musical excellence in the Bachelor of Science in Music

degree at Texas College. The Music program offers a unique experience through Concert Choir with gospel music and a Marching Band featuring a diverse musical style.

Upon completion of Texas College's Music program, students will be able to:

- Demonstrate a command of the competencies associated with the program of study;
- Articulate the ideas, trends, and forms of music; and
- Demonstrate command of the creativity associated with the field.



PROGRAM GOALS

1. The student will be able to identify, define, and explain the general knowledge associated with music history, including the major trends and the composers associated with those trends, as well as general theoretical knowledge associated with the elements of music: sound, harmony, melody, rhythm, and form.
2. The student will analyze, evaluate, and articulate the ideas, trends, and forms of music taught in the major.
3. The student will apply the creative interpretation of appropriate repertoire in a public recital at the end of their applied study.
4. The student will create an orchestration project and a choral arranging project that applies the elements of music, demonstrating the creativity associated with the field of music.
